

Family Adaptation in Childhood Chronic Illness: ■ A Case Report ■

When a child is diagnosed with a chronic illness, families adapt by drawing on the perceptions of individual family members, on the family's existing resources, and on new resources. This method of family adaptation has been described by McCubbin and Patterson in their Family Adaptation Model. The Family Adaptation Model is illustrated through a case study of a family's experience with type I diabetes. The model and case study yield a list of nursing assessments and interventions for families with a chronically ill child. *J PEDIATR HEALTH CARE*, (1991), 5, 78-82

When a child is diagnosed with a chronic illness, the whole family is affected. As one of the major childhood chronic illnesses, type I diabetes affects the family because the family is confronted with a set of relentless demands—the daily burden of care, uncertainty about the future, financial strain, and added medical supervision are some of the added demands on the family (Hobbs, Perrin, & Ivey, 1985; Hobbs & Perrin, 1985). To cope with these demands, families must adapt, and nursing interventions can help. Thus, the purpose of this article is to examine how families adapt when a child is diagnosed with a childhood chronic illness. The article will first explore McCubbin and Patterson's Family Adaptation Model (1983) which draws on general concepts of family stress theory. From this adaptation perspective, the experience of a family with a child who is newly diagnosed with type I diabetes is presented and analyzed. Finally, the article concludes with nursing assessment and interventions for families with a chronically ill child.

■ THE FAMILY ADAPTATION MODEL

McCubbin and Patterson (1983) present a model for family crisis and adaptation. Their model is based on four assumptions drawn from family research and crisis theory: (a) families face hardships and change as a natural and predictable aspect of

family life, (b) families develop basic strengths designed to foster growth and protect from major disruptions, (c) under stress, families develop strengths designed to protect the family from unexpected stresses to foster family adaptability, and (d) particularly during these crises, families benefit from and contribute to the network of relationships and resources in the community (McCubbin & McCubbin, 1987).

The model describes the family at two related phases in its response to life changes: adjustment and adaptation (Fig. 1). In the adjustment phase, the family's vulnerability to a crisis depends on the interaction of three factors: (a) the stressor event and prior strains, (b) the family's existing resources, and (c) the family's subjective perceptions of the seriousness of the stressor event. Given a benign interaction of these factors, some families move through a stress situation without a crisis—the family absorbs the change into routine family functioning. In other families, stresses and strains pile up and demand more adjustment within the family system. When adjustment within the existing system is impossible, crisis occurs.

When a crisis occurs, the family progresses from the adjustment phase to the adaptation phase. The family attempts to adapt and achieve a new sense of balance in the family system. In the adaptation phase, the level of family coping and adaptation emerges in


