compensation for past wrongs The survivors engaged in the politics of memory by preparing compensation claims erecting a monument in memory of the Chief Big Foot massacre at the mass grave on the Pine Ridge Reservation by dictating accounts to sympathetic whites and by testifying before the U S Congress in the 1930s in support of a bill intended to liquidate the liability of the United States for Wounded Knee Despite the bill s failure the survivors prolonged pursuit of justice laid the foundation for later activists who would draw upon the memorial significance of Wounded Knee to promote indigenous sovereignty Published on the 125th anniversary of this controversial event Surviving Wounded Knee examines the Lakota survivors half century pursuit of justice and points to lingering questions about the United States willingness to address the liabilities of Indian conquest
