

BLACK WOMEN'S POETRY IN BRAZIL: THE POLITICS OF RACE AND GENDER

The military coup of 1964, by which the Brazilian military overthrew the democratic government of João Goulart, marked the beginning of a period that many political activists and intellectuals believe to have been the darkest in Brazilian history. In 1968, the military government decreed the Fifth Institutional Act, a constitutional amendment that eliminated civil liberties and temporarily dissolved congress. Violence intensified, and a wave of arbitrary arrests followed. Thousands were imprisoned, tortured, and killed. Others were exiled, returning to the country only after the 1979 political amnesty.

By the late 1970s, the re-birth of popular grassroots movements in urban areas seriously challenged the military regime's legitimacy. Neighborhood associations, feminist organizations, gay and lesbian groups, and the black movement emerged and opened new channels of political debate. They were crucial to the formation and further development of Brazilian democracy. From the 1984 campaign for direct presidential elections to the 1987 *Constituinte* that united social movements around the forging of a new constitution, Brazilians paved the way for the first presidential election in twenty-one years in December 1989. Clearly the re-establishment of civil society produced several transformations in the Brazilian political arena. Non-governmental organizations and other popular groups constructed new ways of doing politics, focused specifically on the community's needs and concerns. Within this novel experiment of politics and popular participation, the black movement flourished.

In this essay, I examine the role of women writers in the Afro-Brazilian movement, showing how they link feminist and black demands, while addressing questions of both gender and race. Both the political participation of women and the problem of gender within the black movement are central to the literary production of Miriam Alves and Esmeralda Ribeiro, who have redefined categories of race and gender according to the double perspective of oppressed women and a powerless race. I especially focus on the poetry of Alves and Ribeiro, as their poems encompass the search for a female black identity in a society that objectifies and commodifies the black woman's body.
