**Gendered** Andrea Fischerová, 2008 This study focuses on the six writing men who have been throughout decades regarded as the alpha and omega of British Romanticism Byron Coleridge Keats Scott Shelley and Wordsworth It sees these men as a representative cohort of their time and examines their letters as results of a reading process Although letters are usually seen as additional sources of reference in literary studies in this book they are treated as the dominant information material correspondence enables to reconsider British Romanticism on the basis of the epistolary communication of the first half of
