found eligible 67% Of those who were not found eligible about a third of children should have qualified based on previous testing and or medical conditions However these qualifying medical conditions were often not clearly documented on the referral form and not all forms included documentation of the scores from developmental testing There were also a significant number 71% of Oregon children referred to EI but never evaluated who were likely to have qualified based on medical history and or results from developmental testing There were several key themes identified Most critically the parent caregiver s perception of the need for the EI referral was identified as an essential factor in facilitating a successful connection to EI Other key themes included the need to honor the many different demands placed on the caregivers of these high risk children as well as the necessity of providing clear explanation of the purpose of both the visit to the high risk infant follow up program and the EI referral
