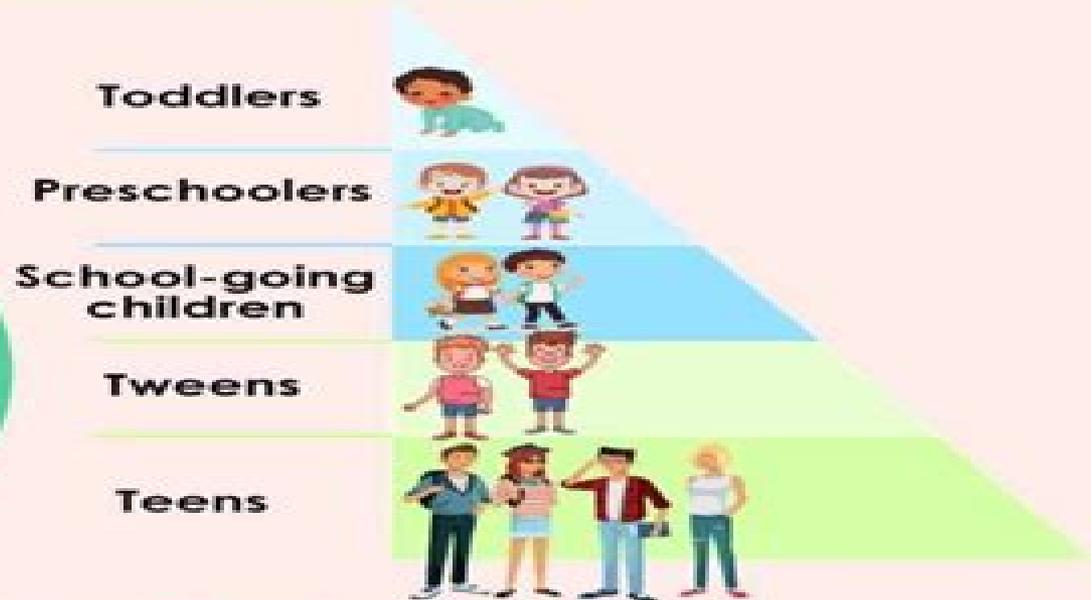



# WHAT IS CHILD DEVELOPMENT?
