

# Peer Relations



- In middle childhood, the society of peers becomes an increasingly important context for development
  - Peer contact contributes to perspective taking and understanding of self and others
  - These developments, in turn, enhance peer interaction
- Compared with preschoolers, school-age children resolve conflicts more effectively, using persuasion and compromise
- Sharing, helping, and other prosocial acts increase
- Aggression declines, especially physical attacks
  - But, verbal and relational aggression continue as children form peer groups
